Students are required to wear plain black shorts, skirts or skorts, in a loose-fitting style, without pictures, patterns or edgings and the length to reach student fingertips when hands are laid along the thigh. Shorts, skirts and skorts with the Durack School logo are available for purchase from the school office and will be compulsory from 2024. Long pants in a loose-fitting style, without pictures, patterns or edgings are part of the school uniform. Students are not to wear denim or leggings.

This week is our final week of school for Term 3. We do hope that everyone has a great break with family and friends and manages to find somewhere cool to be with the weather heating up.

The Executive Leaders are in the playground before and after school and at recess and lunch connecting with students and providing them with opportunities to have their voice heard. 

## School Uniform Policy

#### DURACK SCHOOL STUDENT UNIFORM AND DRESS CODE POLICY

The wearing of a school uniform by students is a compulsory requirement of the NT Department of Education (DoE). The Durack School Uniform and Dress Code Policy has been established after consultation with key stakeholders and has been formulated to meet the needs of students, their families and the school, in line with the DoE 'Sun Safe Policy' and 'Uniform Dress Code'.

#### The intention is to:

- Promote equity, belonging and self-respect.
- Contribute to the tone, pride and high expectations of the school.

Be cost effective for parents and care givers.

#### **Shirts**

- Royal Blue Polo shirt, with embroidered Durack School logo and collar detail.
- Argyle (Red), Lissadell (Green) and Ivanhoe (Yellow) sports shirts may be worn on the day when students are timetabled to participate in Physical Education and on Sports Day. They are not to be worn for excursions, special assemblies (awards, ANZAC Day), school photographs and occasions when students are representing Durack School.
- Year 6 shirts may be worn by Year 6 students. They are not to be worn, for special assemblies (awards, ANZAC Day), school photographs (except for the Year 6 photo) and occasions when students are representing Durack School. Year 6 shirts may be worn on excursions from 2021 onwards.

#### Shorts, Skirts and Skorts

Plain black, in a loose-fitting style, without pictures, patterns or edgings and the length to reach student fingertips when hands are laid along the thigh. Shorts, skirts and skorts with the Durack School logo will be available for purchase from the school office from 2021 and will be compulsory from 2024.

#### **Dresses**

School Tartan. Length slightly above the knee. Bike pants or something similar should be worn underneath.

#### **Long Pants**

Plain Black, in a loose-fitting style, without pictures, patterns or edgings. No denim. No leggings.

#### **Jacket or Jumper**

Blue jackets with the Durack School logo will be available for purchase from the school office from 2021.

#### Hats

Bucket hat including the Durack School logo, available for purchase from the school office. No hat, no play. Students without a school hat will be directed to areas within the school in line with the DoE 'Sun Safe Policy'.

#### Socks

Plain black or white.

#### Shoes

Black or white, enclosed footwear appropriate for educational activities.

#### **Hair Accessories**

Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back with appropriate hair accessories including: hair ties, scrunches and headbands that are neat and tidy (preferably in school colours).

#### **Jewellery**

The only items of jewellery permitted to be worn at school are:

- · medic alert bracelets
- watches: Smart Watches are not to be worn at school

studs or small hooped earrings

Any other jewellery will be removed and must be collected from the school office by a parent.

#### Other

Makeup and nail polish are not permitted at school.

Hair should not be coloured unless for special occasions such as crazy hair day.

#### PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Wearing of the school uniform is compulsory. When uniform guidelines are not met parents will be contacted by leadership.

It is expected that parents will support the Durack Student Uniform and Dress Code Policy.

#### UNIFORM AVAILABILITY

Durack School shirts, shorts, skorts, dresses and jackets can be purchased at the school office.

All clothing must be of clean and tidy appearance. Clothing in need of repair is not to be worn to school.

## Interoception Talk

# Interoception Talk

Interoception talk can also be called body talk. Be aware of how your body feels and talk about that with your child.

## Say things like:

"When I'm holding this glass of water, my hands are cold!"

"When I run around outside with you, my heart rate goes up, so it beats fast!"

"When I step into the cold, it makes my muscles feel tight."

Labeling these things out loud for your children can help them become more aware of how their own bodies are feeling. You are demonstrating to them how to recognize the feelings in their body, and you are also increasing your awareness through this process! Research finds that the more in touch with ourselves, the better off we are when being present and dealing with anxiety, stress, and emotional regulation.


